

Calls for Service: 39,117 Cases Generated: 4,843


Uses of Force: 104; or 0.265% of calls

IN PROGRESS

- A complete review and revision of MCSO's Use of Force policies that is being reviewed by the Merit Board for implementation
- Thorough review of The President's Task Force on 21st Century Policing to check compliance with the reports recommendations
- All sworn personnel to complete a mandatory of three (3) hours of Implicit Bias training

IN PROGRESS CONT.

- Sending four of our Law Enforcement Training Board (LETB) Certified Instructors to De-Escalation training to bring back and train our staff
- All sworn personnel have completed a three day Crisis Intervention Team (CIT) training. We will be sending Deputies from each shift to a more advanced, five day training that is more in-depth

CURRENTLY IN PLACE

- All use of force and reviewed by command staff and logged
- Use of force tracking includes an early warning detection which triggers an additional review
- Use of force documentation includes the age, sex and race of the individual force was used on (implemented May 2020)

CURRENTLY IN PLACE CONT.

- All sworn personnel attends scenario based, use of force training yearly where the Deputy is required to continuously evaluate the situation and de-escalate
- MCSO does not train, or allow the use of "Choke Holds" or "Strangle Holds"
