
MONROE COUNTY JDAI

FY 2019 – 2020 JDAI Highlights

▷ JDAI PARTNERSHIPS:

- With Youth Services Bureau, collaborating to bring Community Awareness event to Monroe County focusing on the myths & realities of *Human Trafficking*.
- Juvenile probation officers are learning more about alternatives to detention opportunities through **Girls Inc.** and the **Boys and Girls Club**.
- Purchase items for youth/family engagement, given out by **local Law Enforcement** (basketballs, footballs, jump ropes, small recognition tokens).



CARE PACKAGES FOR YOUTH AND FAMILIES

Two 'rounds' of care packages given to probation youth.

Delivered by Community Corrections and Probation staff to tell youth and families we are thinking of them during this unprecedented time.

Care Packages: snack items, brainteasers, inspirational coloring pages, crayons, colored pencils, spaghetti sauce and noodles, sidewalk chalk, playing cards, and personal hygiene items.



Third round of gift bags is being prepared to help youth and families with the purchase of school supplies as we plan for a return to classes in August.
