Funding for Public Health Services

Health Fund: Revenue receipted in 2013

Taxes: \$ 580,028.10

Fees: \$ 406,328.30

Misc.: \$ 1,618.27

Grants: \$ 71,172.42

The health fund provides resources for public health services to the community such as identifying health hazards, investigating potential disease transmission, education, developing policy and linking people to services.

Fifteen employees, including the health officer, and the health board, are financially supported through the health fund. This allows the department to provide vital records information, perform inspections, investigations, educate the community and meet the essential services of public health. This is a collaborative effort to ensure the Indiana Code and local ordinance requirements are upheld in order to meet public health standards.

A Sexually Transmitted Disease (STD) grant is also included in the health fund.

Sodium Grant: \$20,000

This grant was awarded to the health department to educate and empower local chefs to reduce sodium use by adapting recipes and procurement.

Local Health Maintenance Fund (LHMF): \$72,672.00

The LHMF supplements the health fund by providing additional health services such as prenatal care for low-income women, vital record support, infectious disease follow-up and environmental health support. Two part-time positions are included in this fund.

Indiana Local Health Department Trust Fund: \$27,130.99

Provides a Tobacco Cessation Health Educator to promote and provide tobacco cessation and education in an effort to reduce death associated with tobacco use and other health risks that contribute to chronic diseases.

Title X and TANF: \$250,484

Fees/donations/3rd party/misc. \$19,857.00

This federal grant comes through the Indiana Family Health Council for reproductive health care and family planning for women. Services include pap smears, breast exams, pregnancy tests, STD screening and treatment, education, and contraceptives. Three full-time positions are included in this grant, one of which is shared by two individuals.

Local Grants to support Title X Clinic

Bio Terrorism: \$ 30,147.98

Funding is provided from the state through Homeland Security and assists the department in developing health emergency preparedness. This grant funded part-time hours for two employees. They worked on preparedness plans, training and Medical Reserve Corp. Funds also provided some much needed emergency equipment and funds to assist in a county wide emergency alert system using email and phones.

Hospital Preparedness, Medical Reserve Corps: \$4,000

This money also originates from the Homeland Security funding, and passes through the state to the local level. These funds are specifically to build Medical Reserve Corps units.
