# Grading Permit Process & On-Site Inspections

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### Apply for a Grading Permit

#### When to apply:

- Over 1,000 square feet of earth is being moved
- Not single-family residential

### Other permits needed (potentially):

- Building permit: Monroe County Building Department
- Demolition permit: Monroe County Building Department
- State-issued permits: Rule 5, Floodplain permit




### How to Apply for a Grading Permit

- Application on the website
- Submit:
  - Site plan
  - Erosion control bond estimate
  - Completed application
- Who signs the application:
  - Certification
  - Erosion Control Responsibility





### Review Process



- Back and forth between staff and design team
- Release held for other departments
- Set a permit release meeting



### Grading Permit Release Meeting

- Who should attend
- Review expectations/conditions
- Deliver final plans & erosion control bond
- Pay permit fee





# On Site Inspections: Before Grading

- Install erosion control measures per approved plans
- Contact City staff for inspection(s)
  - Erosion Control
  - Environmental Considerations
  - Refer back to Grading Permit from the release meeting
- Grading prior to an inspection will result in a Notice of Violation (NOV) and possible fines



# On Site Inspections: During Construction

#### **During Construction:**

- Self-monitoring program required
- Expect random inspections of site during construction
  - Complaints
  - Rain events
  - Check-In
- Inspecting for erosion AND pollutant control (see handout)





# On Site Inspections: Occupancy

- Contact city staff for occupancy inspection
  - Application and payment (\$100 per inspection)
  - Temporary Occupancy due to weather delays (30-45 days)
- Process goes smoothly with active communication
- Final Occupancy recommendation triggers release of erosion control bond
- Schedule inspections with other departments separately



## New Unified Development Ordinance (UDO)

#### Important change:

- Tracking:
  - Previous UDO: "Any sediment reaching a public or private street shall be removed by street cleaning (not flushing) by those responsible before the end of each workday."
  - New UDO: "Any sediment that leaves the site is a violation of this UDO."
