Adolescent Inpatient Psychiatric Program is designed for young people ages 11-18 who have been engaging in substance abuse, have become addicted to alcohol or another drug and/or are experiencing certain co-occurring mental health disorders. A typical stay in this program is 3-21 days.

The Adult Acute Inpatient Treatment Program is designed for men and women ages 18-64 who are struggling with mental, behavioral, psychiatric disorders and/or co-occurring substance abuse issues. Persons who have been unable to wean themselves from their substances of abuse prior to entering treatment may spend 5-10 days in their medically monitored detox program, then transition into inpatient care. A typical stay in this program is 3-21 days.
