However that portion of the CARES ACT ended at the beginning of her quarantine and her employer did not pay her. She had just started her job and did not have any vacation days or sick leave. Trustee paid for her January rent of \$705.00, her Water bill of \$45. We are seeking reimbursement of \$250.00
2. Tracy: PO 21-2--- same situation as above. Clients work on the same manufacturing line and also live in the same Apartment complex. She had already used her vacation time earlier in December to visit family. Trustee paid her January rent of \$735.00 and is requesting reimbursement of \$235.00
3. Michael: PO 21-3--- He is a flooring installer out of work due to Covid, he did get on at Catelent but was let go due to a prior OWI on his license from 5 years ago. Trustee paid rent of \$350, Electric of \$316 and water of \$49.58 and is seeking reimbursement of \$215.58
4. Jill: PO 21-1---Covid positive after having been quarantined once already. She used her PTO so was able to pay rent but went through her gas tank much faster do to the weather and being home all day. Trustee paid \$347.88 and is seeking reimbursement of \$200.00

1. PO# 014785 – Her catering business is suffering due to the pandemic. Requesting assistance with her CBU bill of \$440.19, the trustee will pay a two-month bill of \$172.14 with the remaining balance of \$268.05 being paid by the Commissioners.
2. PO#014790 – Was laid off from her job due to COVID-19 last May 2020. Does not know when she will be called back. Requesting assistance wither water bill of \$160.00. The trustee will pay \$148.26 and the remaining balance of \$11.98 will be paid by the Commissioners.
3. PO#014793 – Was exposed to someone who tested positive for COVID at work and had to take two (2) weeks off of work to quarantine and await his COVID test results. Requesting assistance with his rent of \$1086.02 which will cover December and the remaining balance for November. The trustee will pay his rent benefit of \$615.00 and the Commissioners will pay the remaining \$471.02.
4. PO#014797 – Steve has been quarantining and then took sick leave following COVID exposure and testing positive causing loss in income. Needs rent assistance for two (2) months in the amount of \$1700. The trustee will pay one month's rent \$850.00 and the Commissioners will pay \$850.00.
5. PO#014810 – Rachel was pregnant with twins when COVID hit. She was a home health care aid, her Doctor told her to discontinue working which affected their income hard. She is only eligible for \$168.00 per week in unemployment. They owe 2 months of rent. The Trustee will pay one month's rent of \$695.00 and the Commissioners will pay the remaining balance of \$695.00.

6. PO#014811 – Timothy became ill in September with symptoms he believed to be related to COVID which caused him to have to take off of work. After his tests came back negative his employer let him go anyway for taking off due to being ill. They are asking for one month's rent. The trustee will pay their benefit level of \$738.00 with the Commissioners paying the remaining balance of \$468.00

Monroe County COVID-19 Reimbursement

1. PO#014804 – He was working full-time at the Holiday Inn. He cannot wear a mask for full-time hours. The mask causes him to have migraines that look like strokes or seizures. The trustee is paying one month's rent of \$280.00 with the Commissioners paying the remaining balance of \$280.00
2. PO#014815 – Is requesting assistance with her rent. She owes for 2 months. The monthly rent is \$829.00. She was laid off from work due to COVID-19 related budget cuts. The trustee will pay a monthly benefit level of \$829.00 with the Commissioners paying the remaining balance of \$829.00.
3. PO# 014826 – She is a single mother, working in the restaurant business, hours were cut due to COVID, her son's daycare closed due to COVID. She got behind because of the loss of income and lives paycheck to paycheck. She is two and a half month's behind in rent. The trustee will pay one month's rent of \$575.00 with the Commissioners paying the remaining balance of \$700.00.
4. PO#014825 – Behind two-months in rent. Unable to find employment due to COVID-19. The trustee will pay a one-month rent benefit level of \$615.00 with the Commissioners paying the remaining amount of \$615.00.
5. PO#014829 – Was laid off from Upland Brewery in December due to lack of work because of the pandemic. The trustee is paying a one-month benefit level of \$615.00, the Commissioners will pay the remaining balance of \$436.00
6. PO#014828 – She was laid off from March through June due to COVID because she works in a factory setting that is highly congested with other workers. She is back to work now trying to get caught up on her rent. The trustee will pay a monthly rent benefit of \$615.00 with the Commissioners paying the remaining amount of \$435.63.

7. PO#014832 – She has Rheumatoid arthritis and therefore she has to be picky with the jobs that she can take. This is difficult with the pandemic because jobs are scarce so she has found it difficult to find work within her abilities. The trustee will pay a one-month benefit level of \$615.00 with the Commissioners paying the remaining balance of \$499.00.
8. PO#014837 – Has had a hard time securing employment since he was terminated from Catalent in October, because of the pandemic. Started a new job at Marathon on 1/14/21. The trustee paid a rent benefit of \$615.00, Commissioners paying the remaining balance of \$207.00.
9. PO#014838 – Tested positive for COVID-19 in December was off work for 2 weeks. Trying to get up in rent. The trustee will pay a monthly benefit level of \$738.00 with the Commissioners paying the remaining balance of \$637.00.
10. PO#014841 – She terminated employment to be home with the children who are learning from home because school shut down due to the pandemic. The trustee paid one month's rent of \$680.00 with the Commissioners paying a second month's rent of \$680.00.
11. PO#014847 - Is on stress medical leave due to COVID-19. She requesting assistance with her rent of \$710.00. The trustee will pay one month's benefit level of \$615.00 with the Commissioners paying the remaining amount of \$95.00.

1. Braden: PO#014845 – Due to COVID-19 Braden is struggling to find suitable employment because of his disability. Is requesting assistance with his Vectren Bill of \$316.70. The trustee will pay a 2-month bill of \$91.89 and the Commissioners will the remaining balance of \$224.81.
2. Rhonda: PO#014849 – Her husband passed away unexpectedly in December. She is having a hard time seeking employment due to the pandemic. Is requesting assistance with her rent that she got behind in. The trustee will pay her benefit level of \$615.00 with the Commissioners paying the remaining rent balance for February of \$325.00.
3. Pamela: PO#014848 – Husband passed away from COVID-19 and he was the sole earner. Her oldest son got COVID. Scared to send her kids to school so they are doing E-learning and she is having trouble finding work that fits with their schedule. Pamela's monthly rent is \$1350 per month, she has \$391.00 to pay towards February's rent but needs help paying the remaining balance of \$959.00. The trustee will pay her rent benefit level of \$853.00 with the Commissioners paying the remaining balance of \$106.00.
4. Debra & Terrance: PO#014850 – Terrance is Debra's full-time caregiver and is unable to seek additional employment to help supplement their income. Also, even if he were able to get another job it would put Debra in jeopardy of contracting COVID-19 due to her lower immune system. They are requesting assistance with their Duke bill that's several months behind. The trustee will pay a 2-month balance of \$477.54 with the Commissioners also paying a 2-month bill of \$453.43.
5. Erica: PO#014858 – Erica worked at the IU Health hospital in the culinary department. She stated that her co-workers did not practice social distancing nor wear their masks correctly. She stated a lot of her co-workers and herself got COVID-19 related symptoms but was never diagnosed with it, but it still caused her to take off of work and self-quarantine until symptoms subsided. She felt that it was an unsafe work environment due to her co-workers not following CDC guidelines. Erica is

requesting assistance with her monthly rent of \$855.00. The trustee will pay her rent benefit level of \$615.00 with the Commissioners paying the remaining balance of \$240.00.

6. Claudia: PO#014861 – Claudia has a new job at Bloomington Hospital but due to COVID-19 she is required to get special vaccines that she has to go to Indy for and her car is not in good working order. She is requesting one month's rent of \$850.00. The trustee is approving her for her benefit level of \$615.00 with the Commissioners paying the remaining balance of \$250.00.

7. David: PO#014863 - Was employed at Bloomington Bagle Company until they closed due to COVID-19 last March. David was receiving unemployment benefits until 12/20/20 when they stopped. Currently, he is unable to work due to a recent surgery/doctor restrictions. He has no income at this time. David is requesting assistance with his rent. His monthly rent is \$725.00, he owes just under 2 months totaling \$1340.00. The trustee will pay his rent benefit level of \$615.00 with the Commissioners paying the remaining balance of \$725.00.

8. Tenisha: PO#014871 – Is employed and was promised 40 hours per week at Taco Bell, but with the Dining room being closed due to COVID, the business has slowed down and her hours were cut. Tenisha is requesting one month's rent of \$960.00. The trustee will pay her rent benefit level of \$615.00 with the Commissioners paying the remaining balance of \$345.00.

9. Darlene: PO#014872 – Has COPD and it has worsened causing her to be prescribed more inhalers that are very expensive. She is on SSI receiving \$1692.00/month, but she started working to help supplement the extra costs of her prescriptions, but she was unable to keep it due to having to wear a mask her whole shift to comply with COVID restrictions. Darlene is wanting to get caught up on her rent so she could get case management services started and start with a clean slate, hopefully, to not see her again in the future. Her monthly rent is \$550.00, she owes a total of \$1530.00. The trustee will pay one month of rent of \$550.00 with the Commissioners paying the remaining balance of \$980.00.
