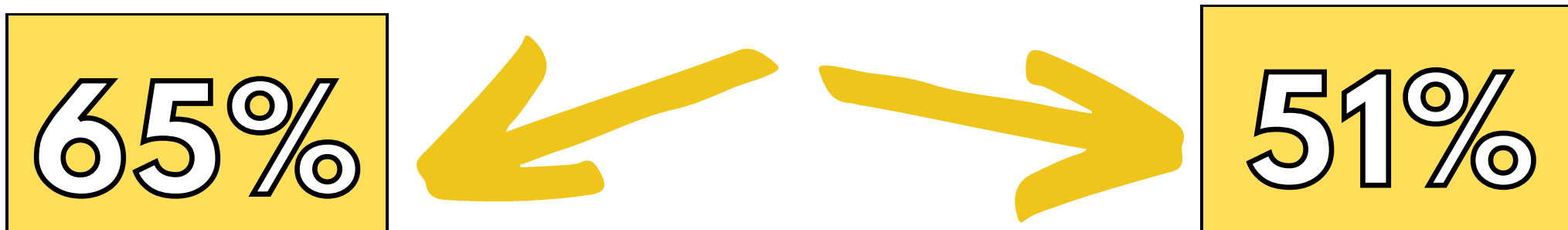


WE CAN LEGALLY STOP ANNEXATION THROUGH 'REMONSTRATION'

Indiana law allows property owners to participate in a process called remonstration. How it works:


- 01 The City publishes a legal notice announcing the annexation.
- 02 The County Auditor issues official remonstrance petitions for property owners in annexation areas to sign.
- 03 Affected homeowners then have 90 days to sign their remonstrance petitions. (Petitions are available at the Monroe County Courthouse.)

YOUR VOICE COUNTS



If 65% of eligible property owners in an individual annexation area complete their remonstrance petitions, their annexation is considered null and void. In other words, **annexation fails**.

If 51% of eligible property owners in an individual annexation area complete their remonstrance petitions, their annexation case can go to court and **a judge will decide** whether or not their area should be annexed.
